

Hokkesan Ichijo-ji Temple



Hokkesan Ichijo-ji is the 26th temple on the Saigoku Kannon Pilgrimage. The three-storied pagoda is a national treasure and one of the oldest pagodas in Japan, dating back to the latter half of the Heian Period.





 Exhibitions of sake brewing tools and historical materials related to small cargo vessels.


